



St Paul's Catholic Primary School Uniform Policy and Dress Code Updated January 2022

2022 will see the introduction of our new school uniform and logo at St Paul's. During the transition period students may continue to wear the original uniform. However, students may not wear a combination of both uniforms with the exception of school socks and the school hat (new items to replace the former).

Please also note that there are not any second-hand items of the former uniform available for sale at the school.

Rationale:

At St Paul's Catholic Primary School, we believe that a school uniform:

- can provide a sense of identity for students attending our school.
- is a way for parents and staff to assist children to adopt a sense of pride in both their personal appearance and their school.
- can deter students focusing on fashion trends unnecessarily.
- eliminates possible conflict over what to wear or buy and assists in the prevention of discrimination based on dress.
- provides an economic means of clothing children over their years of schooling.
- provides a common ground for all parents and students.
- has elements of the Dress Code also incorporated for reasons of safety (e.g. no dangling earrings).

Purchase and Wearing of the Uniform

Parents are asked to ensure that children are wearing the correct school uniform prior to leaving home each day. To maintain the integrity of our uniforms, and in keeping with enrolment expectations, only 'school issued' uniforms are to be worn; clothing purchased from other retailers or chain stores may not comply with our school uniform.

St Paul's school uniform is supplied by Jenny Franklin Enterprises and only these items from this supplier are part of our school uniform.

All items are available in the following ways:

1. At St Paul's uniform shop each Tuesday from 2.30pm-3.15pm.
2. Online ordering with items delivered within a few days directly to school.
3. At the JFE shop, 1/85 Guthrie Street, Osborne Park.

Please note:

1. New and original uniform clothing items may not be mixed – students to wear either the new uniform **or** original uniform during the transition phase.
- 2*. The following items only may be worn by all students with both uniforms:
 Girls: St Paul's school socks (white with blue stripes on ankle)
 Boys: St Paul's school socks (grey with blue stripes on ankle)
 Sport: St Paul's school socks (white with blue stripes on ankle)
 School bucket hat with House colour on the inside.

School Shoes

The following are examples of appropriate footwear. Black shoes that are sneakers or canvas shoes are not acceptable. Sandals are an option for Pre K to Pre Primary students.



Sports Shoes

Sneakers should be all white or, if not possible to access this in your child's size, with very minimal navy-blue trim. Basketball type sneakers are not suited to sport activities.



Pre-Primary, Kindy and Pre Kindy only

Blue sandals or sneakers with Velcro close



Jewellery and Accessories

The only jewellery permitted to be worn is as listed:

- Earrings are to be plain round stud or plain sleeper and only one per ear in the ear lobe.
- A simple strap watch may be worn.
- A small necklace of a religious significance e.g. a cross, crucifix or medallion, may be worn under uniform.
- Mobile phones or other devices which have a recording function may not be brought to school. In exceptional circumstances a student who requires mobile phone access outside of school hours, for example to contact parent or caregiver, must leave the phone with the class teacher until the end of the day.

Personal Grooming

- Students are expected to take pride in their appearance and in the way they wear their uniform.
- Nail polish or make up must not worn.
- Hats with the school logo to be worn whenever the student is outdoors and on excursions. (No hat, no play)
- For hygiene reasons hats may not be shared.

Hairstyles

Hairstyles should be modest/conservative – no extreme cutting, unnatural colouring or excessive use of styling products such as gel, mousse or wax. While we accept that trends in hairstyles change from year to year, we ask that parents support us in keeping hairstyles ‘conservative’.

- Collar length hair must be tied up.
- Hair should be brushed and kept off the face.
- Hair bands and ribbons must be either blue or white.
- House colours (red, yellow or blue) may be worn at sports carnival events.
- Mohawk styles, shapes cut into hair, shaving, spiked up hair or any extreme version of hairstyle is not acceptable.
- Parents are expected to be the ones to regulate hairstyles from home and to say ‘no’ to their children when required. ‘Holiday hairstyles’ are to be kept for out of term times.

Children representing their school on excursions, in school photographs and at sporting or other formal events are expected to dress in appropriate uniform as required.

Students who are in incorrect uniform for any reason should bring a note to class teacher. Similarly, a reminder note will be sent home for incorrect uniform.

Cooperation and respect for school rules is important and we rely on parents taking the lead.
