

Uniform Guidelines

Our uniform is worn with pride. It is a sign of our community, incorporating our tradition and school culture.

Wearing the correct uniform with pride is a sign of respect and parents/guardians commit to this when enrolling their children at St. Paul's.

Students are expected to wear the correct, complete uniform at all times. Students are expected to take pride in their personal appearance and to be neatly attired. Each student is expected to be properly attired in full school uniform or sport uniform whilst at the school, travelling to and from school and when representing the school at external functions and events.

It is compulsory to wear the School Hat while participating in Physical Education classes and other outdoor lessons and excursions. A 'No Hat, No Play' rule is enforced throughout the year.

Uniform Requirements

Pre-Kindergarten (3-year-old) & Kindergarten

- No formal uniform required.
- Students welcome to wear St Paul's Kindy t-shirt. (Available from JFE)
- Sandals or sneakers with Velcro.
- St Paul's bucket hat with House colour on the inside (optional) or own choice.

Pre-Primary

- St Paul's sports polo shirt
- St Paul's navy-blue shorts or skort
- St Paul's school/sports socks (white with blue stripes on ankle)
- White sneakers or navy sandals
- St Paul's navy tracksuit jacket and pants for winter or as needed.
- St Paul's bucket hat with House colour on the inside (optional).

SUMMER (Terms 1 & 4) Years 1-6

Girls

- Blue checked tunic, button front and navy piping.
- Navy blue school cardigan or jumper as needed.
- St Paul's school/sports socks (white with blue stripes on ankle)
- Black lace-up or buckle shoes / navy sandals
- St Paul's reversible bucket hat with House colour on inside
- Sky blue short sleeved shirt
- Navy blue shorts (St Paul's navy-blue school socks with stripes)

Boys

- Sky blue short-sleeved shirt
- Navy blue shorts
- Navy blue school cardigan or jumper as needed.
- St Paul's navy-blue school socks with stripes
- Black lace-up/Velcro shoes / navy sandals

WINTER (Terms 2 & 3) Years 1-6

Girls

- Sky blue short-sleeved shirt
- Navy tartan skirt or Girls' navy trousers
- Tunic Yrs 1-3
- Tartan tie (Years 1-3 optional)
- Navy blue school cardigan or jumper
- St Paul's school/sports socks (white with blue stripes on ankle) or
- Navy blue school tights
- Black lace-up/Velcro/ buckle shoes
- St Paul's reversible bucket hat with House colour on inside

Boys

- Sky blue short-sleeved shirt
- Navy blue school trousers
- Tartan tie (Years 1-3 optional)
- Navy blue school cardigan or jumper
- St Paul's blue school socks with stripes
- Black lace-up/Velcro shoes
- St Paul's reversible bucket hat with House colour on inside



PHYSICAL EDUCATION & SPORT Girls & Boys Years 1-6

House Colours ORMOND

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- St Paul's sports polo shirt worn on Sport days
- St Paul's Physical Education House shirt worn on PE days
- St Paul's navy-blue shorts
- St Paul's skort
- St Paul's school/sports socks (white with blue stripes on ankle)
- White sneakers
- St Paul's reversible bucket hat with House colour on inside
- St Paul's navy tracksuit jacket and pants (as needed)





ADDITIONAL ITEMS

- Hair ties in school and House colours
- St Paul's school bag
- St Paul's school tie (Term 2&3 optional Yrs 1-3)
- Homework/Library bag
- Swimming/Sports drawstring bag
- Winter windproof jackets (optional navy-blue)
- Navy blue scarf (optional winter only)

School Shoes

The following are examples of appropriate footwear.

Black shoes that are sneakers or canvas shoes are not acceptable.







Sports Shoes

Sneakers should be all white or, if not possible to access this in your child's size, with very minimal navy- blue trim.

Basketball type shoes are not suitable for the activities the children do during sport.





Jewellery

The only jewellery permitted to be worn is as listed:

- Earrings are to be plain round stud or plain sleeper and only one per ear in the ear lobe.
- •A simple strap watch may be worn. Smart Watches must be on 'School mode'
- A small necklace of religious significance e.g. crucifix or medallion, may be worn under uniform.
- Mobile phones or other devices which have a recording function may not be brought to school.

Personal Grooming

- Students are expected to be well-groomed at all times.
- Nail polish or make up must not worn.
- •St Paul's school hat to be worn when the student is outdoors and on excursions. (No Hat, No Play) For hygiene reasons hats may not be shared.

Hairstyles

Hairstyles should be modest/conservative – no extreme cutting, unnatural colouring or excessive use of styling products such as gel, mousse or wax.

While we accept that trends in hairstyles change from year to year, we ask that parents support us in keeping hairstyles 'conservative'.

- Collar length hair must be tied up.
- Hair should be brushed and kept off the face.
- Hair bands and ribbons to be either blue or white with academic uniform.
- House colours (red, yellow or blue) may be worn at sports carnival events.

Parents are expected to be the ones to regulate hairstyles from home and to say 'no' to their children when required. 'Holiday hairstyles' are to be kept for out of term times.

Cooperation and respect for school rules are important and we rely on parents taking the lead.
